Dear Senator Robinson and Representative Ormsby and Committee Members,

The Community Advocacy Coalition for Developmental Disabilities (CAC) is asking you to keep the promise: Please consolidate state institutions for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) and continue growing community services so folks with IDD can thrive.

We support HB 1472 and SB 5393 - Closing the Yakima Valley school and Rainier school.

- People will not lose access to intermediate care facilities for people with intellectual disabilities. Those will continue at both <u>Fircrest</u> and <u>Lakeland Village</u>.
- Nor will they lose access to skilled nursing care for people with IDD. Those will also continue at Fircrest and Lakeland Village.
- By statute, overnight and short-term respite care (up to 30 days) will continue at Yakima Valley.

We support investments in helping people transition to community from institutional settings. These services are <u>in place now</u> – and many people with IDD have tapped them to transition safely out of institutional settings, including 6 years ago when the <u>federal government de-certified and pulled Medicaid funding</u> from Rainier.

It is critical that adequate services are provided in community settings. Those of us with the most complex needs can and are supported successfully in the community. All relevant research supports the fact that community settings result in improved quality of life in areas such as: integration, social participation, employment, choice-making and self-determination, quality and duration of services, contact with friends and relatives, and other indicators of quality of life.

OUR PRIORITIES THIS SESSION

- Stabilize the community workforce so people can access their services:
 - o Increase rates for Supported Living community residential services
 - o Increase rates for community day respite services
- Invest in housing
- End isolation/seclusion in public schools
- Ensure vulnerable populations can access DDA community services
- Continue to phase out institutions and invest in community-based services.
