Distance and Virtual Communication is a vital and necessary addition to the health, safety and quality of life for so many people. The TED program can help those who are deaf, hard of hearing, live without speech or have a speech impairment receive equipment and training in order to connect with people/business/medical offices outside of their home. iPhones, iPADS, and electrolarynx devices are examples of what is available. Assistive technology equipment to support those who have physical disabilities are available as well. Training is provided virtually or in the home. Training is always free and equipment is often free as determined by sliding scale.

WHAT: Two Core Members of the Youth and Young Adult Housing Response Team will be available to meet with youth, young adults, public employees, service providers, families, community members and others who are seeking more information about:

- Consultation and resources available to youth and young adults in Washington state.

WHY: The Youth and Young Adult Housing Response Team recognizes that there are approximately 1,000 young people per year exiting systems of care who will experience homelessness. The Response Team seeks to be available to provide consultation and support as broadly as possible.




