**Plan for Success:**

- Look for camps or organizations open to family participation, ideas or suggestions
- Consider your child's abilities
- Present your child in a positive light
- Visit the program/activity location prior to the first day of camp or class
- Work with your child on gaining appropriate skills
- Ensure they have the necessary equipment, clothing and personal supplies
- Ask if there's anything you can do to help your child and staff have a great experience

## 1.) Personal Emergency Response Systems

Do you live alone, are alone for long periods of the day, or live with others who cannot contact emergency services? If you qualify for Community First Choice, you may be eligible for a basic Personal Emergency Response System.

A Basic PERS is an electronic device you wear, like a necklace or bracelet, that you use to get help in an emergency. It is connected to an emergency response center through your landline or mobile phone. When activated, it calls the response center for you.

## Immigration Subcabinet - "We are taking action to protect the rights and interests of all Washingtonians." - Governor Ferguson

On September 25th 2025, Governor Bob Ferguson announced **Executive Order 25-09**, which created the Immigration Subcabinet. This Immigration Sub-Cabinet helps coordinate efforts across state agencies on immigration, disability, and LGBTQ+ issues, while reaffirming Washington's commitment to protecting these communities and their rights, including protecting their data.

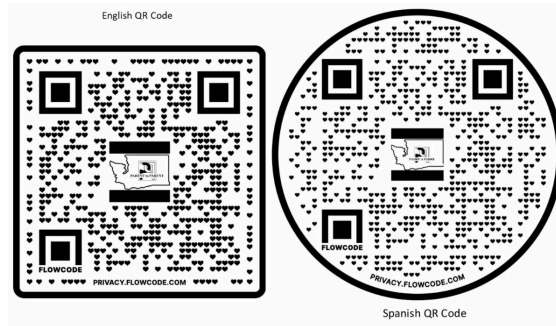

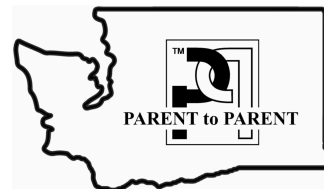
